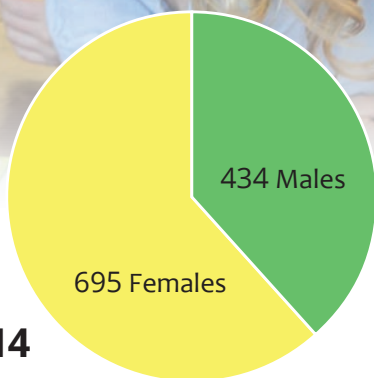

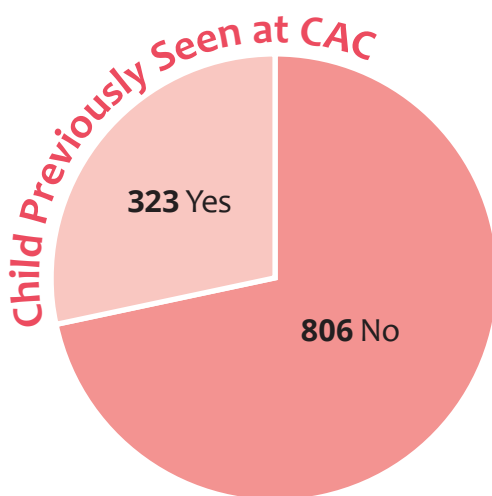
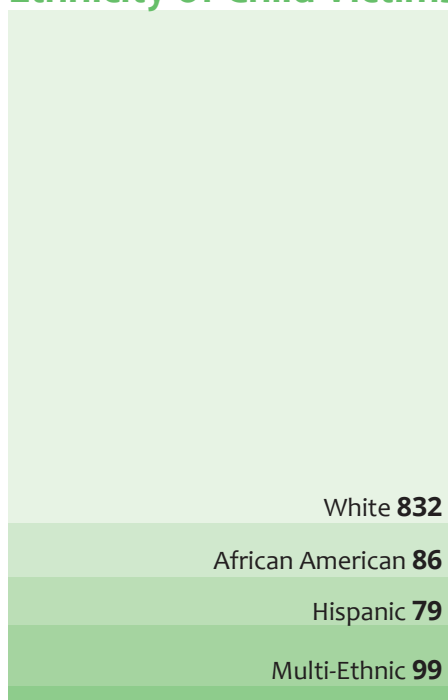




1129 Total Number of Unduplicated Child Victims Seen in 2014



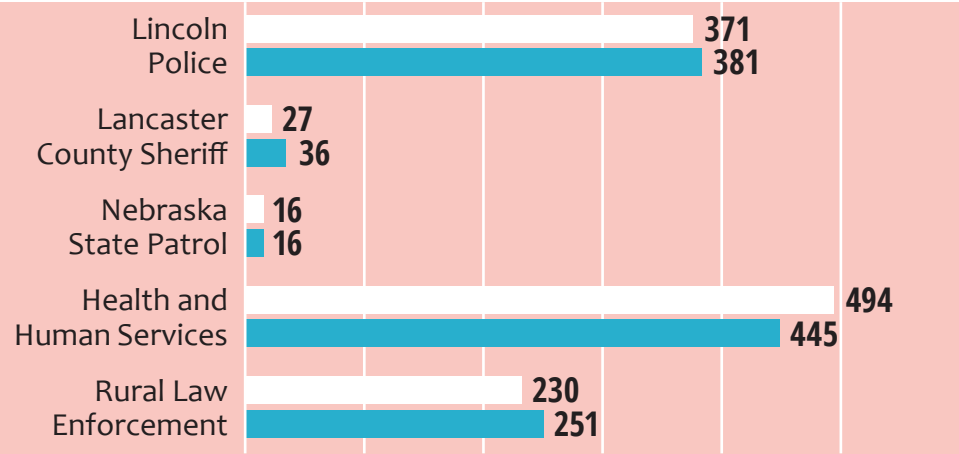
Ethnicity of Child Victims



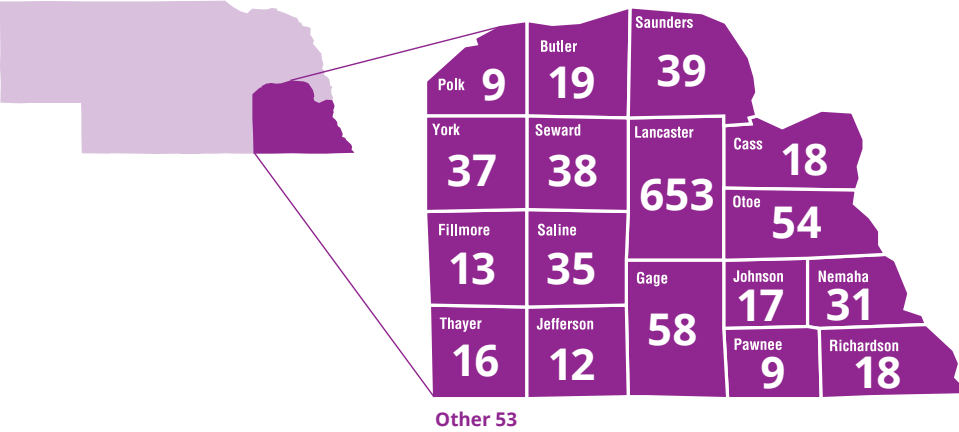

Referring Agency Comparison

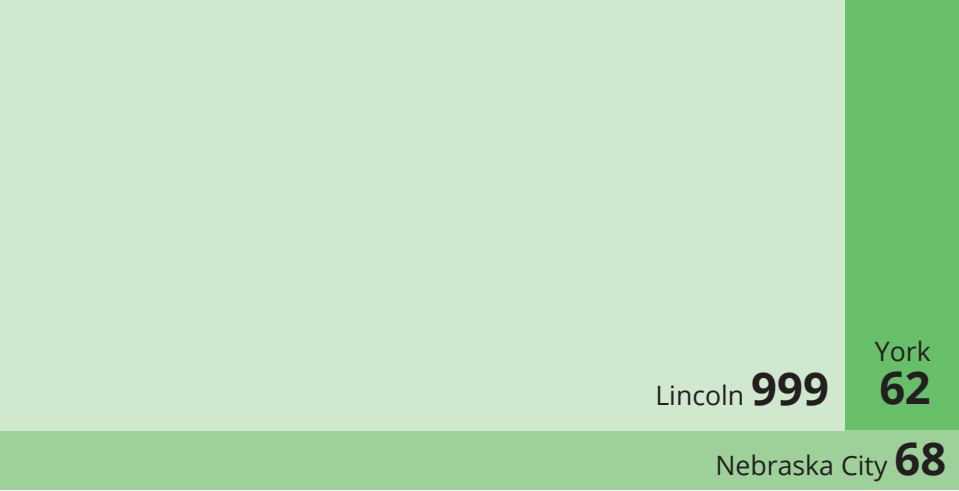

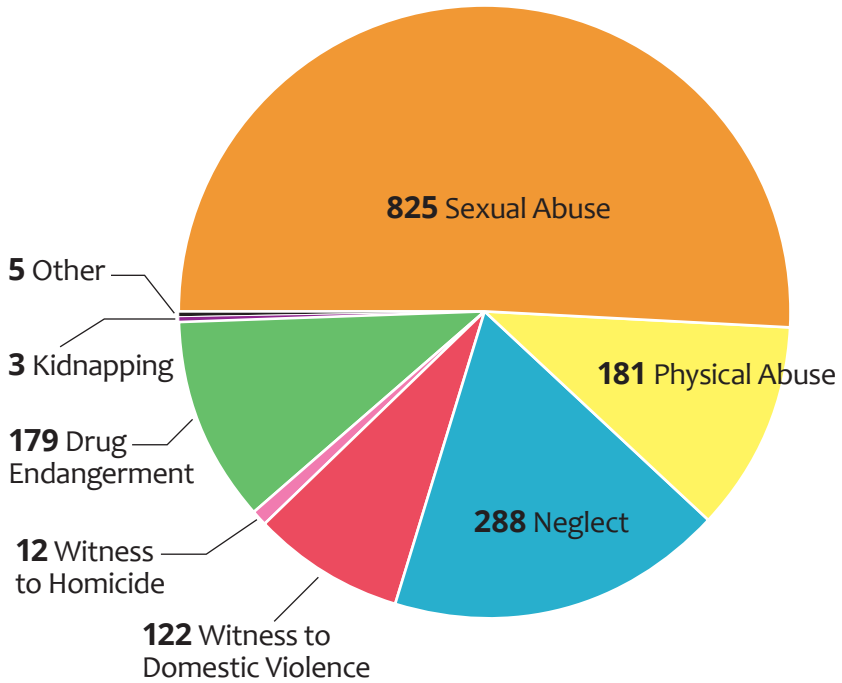


Utilization of Satellite Offices *Children Seen by Location*

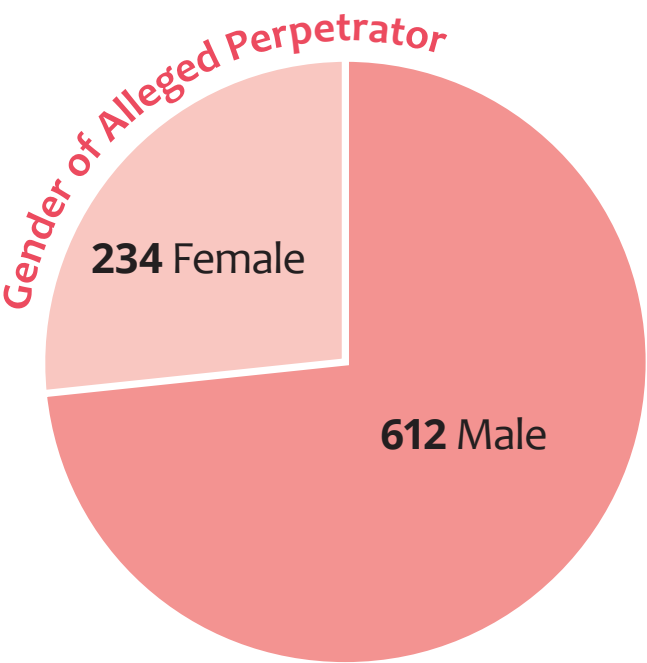
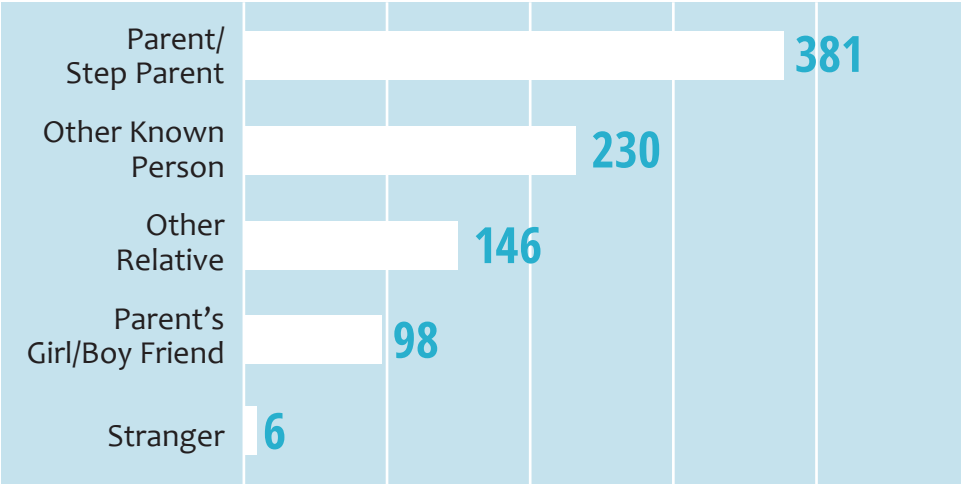




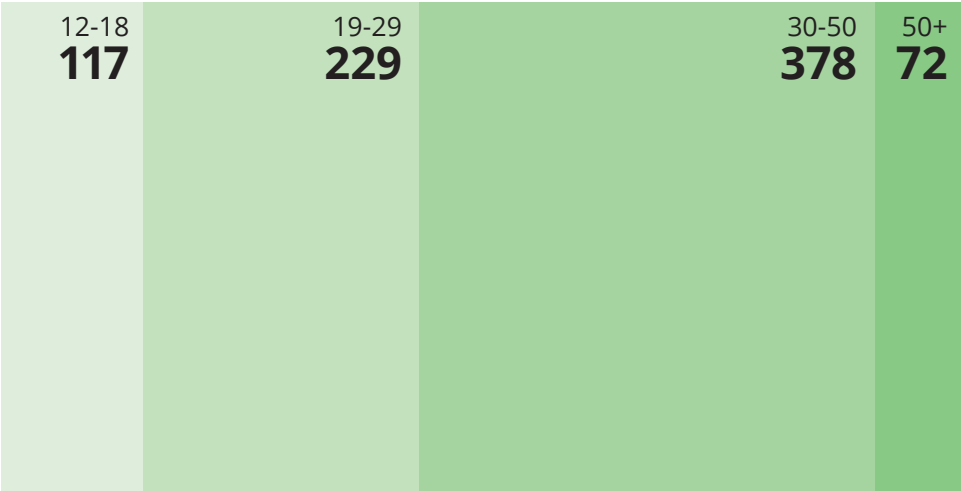
Reason for Referral

Age of Alleged Perpetrator

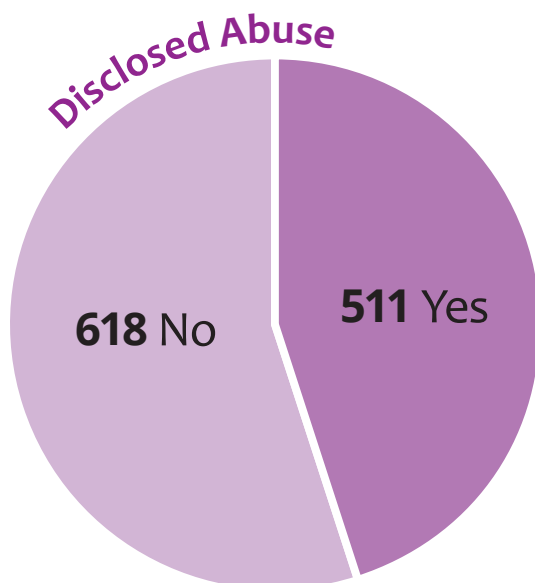




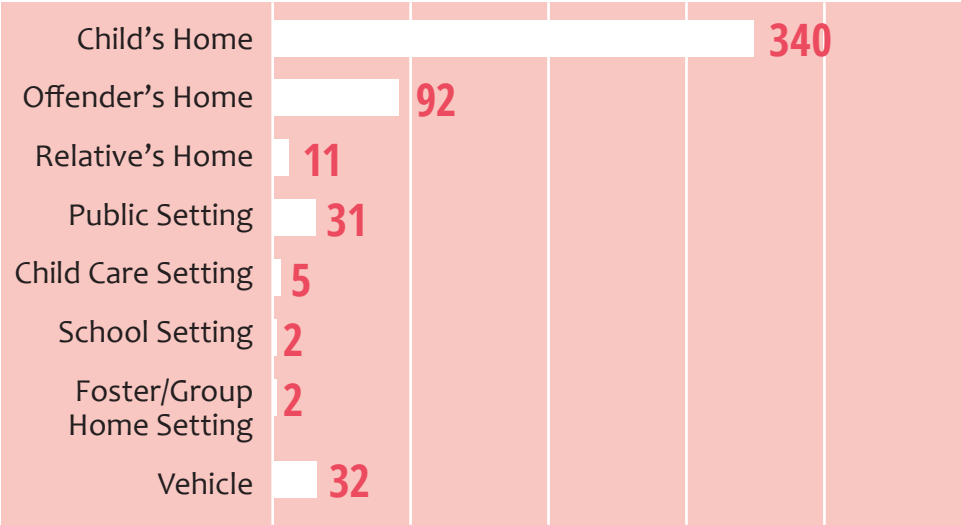

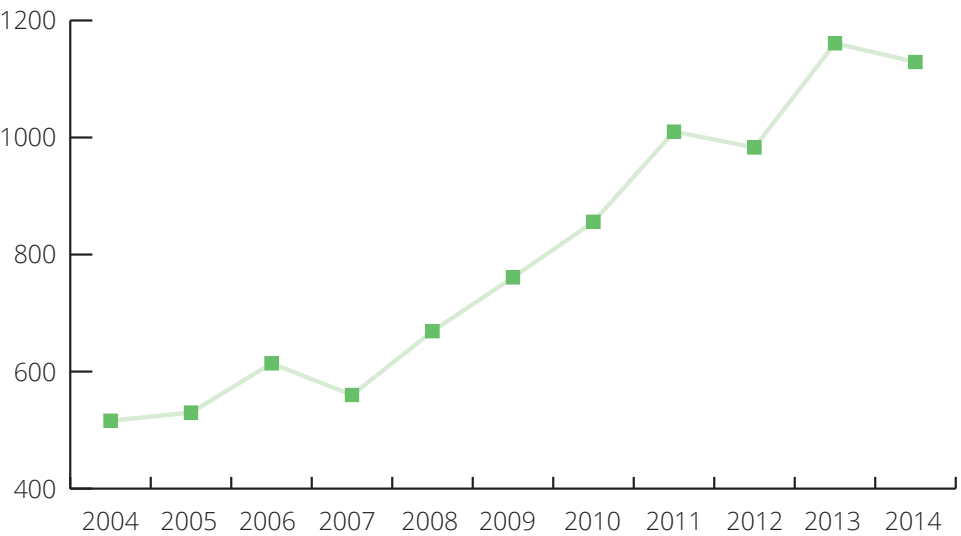
Location of Abuse

Total Number of Unduplicated Child Victims Seen

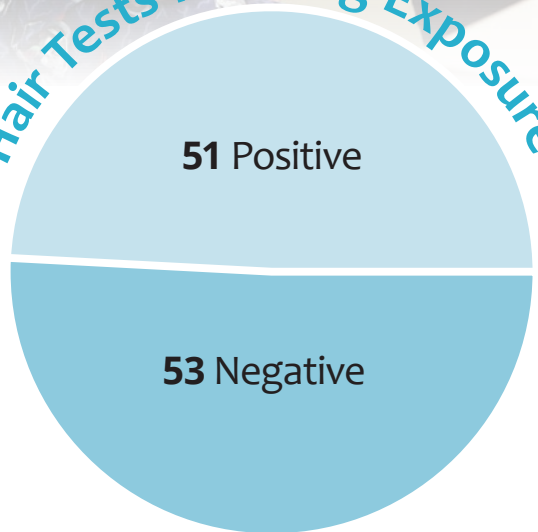
