- Increase the successful prosecution of their abusers




- Forensic interviews

Since 2009, we have seen a 61% increase in the number of children served per year.









**Referring Agency Comparison** 



#### **County of Jurisdiction**




#### Utilization of Satellite Offices Children Seen by Location











#### **Alleged Perpetrator**





#### **Age of Alleged Perpetrator**







# Total Number of Forensic Interviews Conducted in 2019

#### **Location of Abuse**







#### Take A Stand for Kids:

#### Attend a training

One of the best ways for you to engage with the CAC is to become educated on the issue of child abuse. Check out our Event Calendar at www.smallvoices.org to find a training to attend.

#### **Trainings include:**

- Darkness to Light: Stewards of Children learn about child sexual abuse and the steps you can take to prevent, recognize and react responsibly.
- Child Abuse and Neglect 101 learn about your role as a mandatory reporter and gain the knowledge and skills to recognize and report child abuse and neglect.
- Human Trafficking learn about the roles and responsibilities of the multidisciplinary team members when they respond to child abuse and neglect.

#### Volunteer

Volunteers help at the CAC in a multitude of ways, ranging from aiding in day-to-day tasks to assisting with awareness and fundraising events.

#### Potential volunteer activities could include:

- Serving on an event planning committee/aiding day of the event
- Landscaping/building maintenance
- Helping with clerical projects like mailings, cleaning and organization
- The CAC is happy to accommodate group volunteer projects on an as-needed basis.

#### **Donate**

Donations from individuals and corporate partners provide us with the resources we need to help child victims and their families. Donations of any amount are welcome.

#### Here's how far your donation can go:

- On-going advocacy and support for one child = \$3,000
- Medical evaluation for one child = \$600
- Forensic interview for one child = \$500
- Court School for one child = \$100
